- The criteria for writing (for 5 ECTS or 10 ECTS) and assessing a written paper are

regulated by *Rules of Approval, Presentation and Defence of the Final Paper*.

Written work, depending on the volume will make either 33% or 66% of the final grade for the master's examination.

- Apprehension of the causal links between religious and cultural phenomena and creating the new ones.
- Skills of recognition and analysis of the main features of the religious history and Christianity in the different cultural phenomena.
