



Popularization of the Institute's Activities and Public Services and Endeavors

Special endeavors	Open House Day every year in April.
	The church service conducted every study session, is open for the public.
	Annually conferences on various theological topics.
	Summer days every year in August for pastoral care givers and counsellors.
	In cooperation with Chaplaincy of the Ministry of Social Affairs pastoral care givers and counsellors consultation will be launched in February 3-4, 2023 and the goal is to continue organizing this event annually.
Participation in conferences and presentations	Members of academic staff are often called to make presentations in different conferences (see ETIS and Institute's website).
Lifelong learning courses	Through continuing education courses, we have contributed additionally into development of PCC, diakonia, ministry, church organizational work, specific theological topics and other areas (see Institute's webpage). From these courses we have welcomed new students to our degree programmes.
	In professional trainings of church music, in addition to church musicians and ministers, also the music teachers from public schools and choir conductors take part.

	Promoting of the Institute through FB page of EELC.
Collaboration of our lecturers, staff and students with different media publications	Articles in different publications. The Institute's website has a separate section to present employees social activities and their articles in public media. Two main publication channels are: 1) web magazine " Kirik ja teoloogia " (Church and Theology), 2) newspaper " Eesti Kirik " (Estonian Church).
	Couple of times a year, the Institute is promoted in longer talk-shows of different radio stations (<i>Vikerraadio, Kuku raadio, Pereraadio</i>). Shorter interviews before different events in <i>Pereraadio</i> (Family Radio), Raadio 7 (Radio 7).
Public services	The Institute's library and library of Orthodox department are open to public, as well as offering opportunities for research-work on site and counselling.
	The Institute's life-long learning courses are open to public.
	Church Music department teachers and alumni take actively part in public music events giving concerts (organ concerts, choirs represented in song festivals etc.) and serve as church musicians in different churches.
Other	Lecturers and staff serve and preach regularly in different church services.
	Versatile field trips for students, staff and alumni are not publicly advertised but also friends and family of the target group participate in them – this activity is serving indirectly the general public as well.
