#### Conference

At this conference, we want to discuss where Protestant influences manifest themselves in our European societies and where Protestantism becomes visible. We will examine these issues with reference to a range of religious-sociological and ecclesiological approaches. At the same time, we shall also consider the point at which Protestantism can and should assume responsibility and what rays of hope it can offer to society. The conference thus aims to reveal the binding points of Protestantism in Europe. The conference is aimed especially at young theologians between the age of 25 and 35 from European countries, e.g. ministers, deacons, religious teachers, students of theology near their exam or in the qualification phase and pastors in training.

## **Project**

The conference is part of the "Forum Young Theology in Europe" that consists in conferences and online lectures (recordings of the lectures and accounts of the 2022 conference in Vienna can be found on www.young-theology.eu). The aim of the project is to deepen the understanding of the challenges European protestantism faces in different countries within a network of young theologians and to produce specific outputs for practice in school, parish and civil society debates.

### **Organizers**

The Evangelischer Bund Hessen (Protestant League Hesse) promotes theological education and the knowledge of the different Christian denominations as well as ecumenical understanding. The Protestant League is the sponsor of the Denominational Institute (Konfessionskundliche Institut) in Bensheim in southern Hesse.

The Communion of Protestant
Churches in Europe (CPCE) unites 96
Lutheran, Methodist, Reformed and
United Churches from over thirty
countries in Europe and South America. The CPCE came into existence
because of the Leuenberg Agreement
of 1973, which concluded: churches
are allowed to be different because
they appeal to the Gospel as their
common basis.

The Center of Protestant Theology in Eastern Europe (ZETO) offers different types of education and training, all characterized by learning in an intercultural diaspora situation: German language courses, Bachelor in Protestant Theology, contact studies, guest vicariates, doctoral studies. Its work creates an interface between church and society.
